

Ashford University Student Right-to-Know Act Graduation Rate Report

In accordance with the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, Ashford University is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our 2006-2007 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduates and student athletes that received athletic financial aid.

During the fall 2006 semester, 286 first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students entered Ashford University. After 6 years (as of August 2012), 21% of these students had graduated from Ashford University. While reviewing this information, please keep the following in mind:

- All graduation rates are based upon 3 years of attendance for associate's programs and 6 years of attendance for bachelor's programs, which equates to 150% of the normal completion time of our longest program.
- We have elected not to report transfer-out rates because our University's mission does not include providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible institution without completing or graduating.
- These charts do not identify the reasons why our students withdrew; therefore, students who withdrew for personal or medical reasons are included.
- Graduation rates do not include students who left school to serve in the U.S. Armed Forces, on official church missions, or with a foreign aid service of the federal government, or students who died or were totally and permanently disabled.
